We will continue to communicate through the Friday Flyer/Website/Anomaly Board etc... so parents have as much notice as possible about different events. • We are currently reviewing our school meals. There are always 2 hot options and a sandwich option. Parents will be asked about meal choices after Easter so let us know your ideas/thoughts before we make any decisions regarding menu design. • Mixed classes are a necessity based on pupil numbers moving through the school. Children are taught according to need and work is provided to match their ability. Mixed classes work very well and the staff are skilled in delivering appropriate work. • The school has regular staff meetings to inform staff of updates within teaching and learning as well as sharing good practice across the school. • The school provides music tuition to Year 4 pupils and takes part in Young voices biannually. Every class has music lessons and we put our name down for as many music/choral events that come our way. • The school behaviour system is robust and is followed by all staff. Where children do start to disrupt lessons, they are dealt with quickly and effectively so no learning time is lost for other children. We do speak to parents regarding issues of unacceptable behaviour to keep such incidents to a minority. • The school provides specialist coaching through Premier Sports and will continue to source sports opportunities and clubs for children to take part in as we have many children who engage well in physical activity.
