

## Impact of the pupil premium on pupil outcomes in 2015

We have focussed on the achievement gap between our 'ever6 FSM' pupils and the rest of the pupils.

### Objectives in spending PPG:

- To raise attainment for all pupils through accelerated progress to narrow the gap for pupils entitled to the Pupil Premium grant
- To provide catch up support for pupils in Reading, Writing and Maths
- To build self-confidence and motivation for learning, to enable children to develop into independent learners who are proud of their achievements
- To offer enhanced opportunities, through access to extra-curricular activities and trips subsidies for low income families
